

Physical Accessibility

As part of our work to ensure the 2022 Lorne Sculpture Biennale program is accessible and inclusive, the following steps are in place for physical accessibility:

- All indoor workshops, events and performances will be wheelchair accessible. Where a venue does not have wheelchair access, portable ramps have been hired.
- Hand rails and stairs at all venues will be checked for stability and lighting.




- The Small Sculpture exhibition will be installed with accessibility in mind with large, clear fonts displaying artist information and adequate space for people using mobility aides.
- Reserved seating at events for people with accessibility needs and support person/s.
- Entrances and exits to venues will be well-lit.
- For outdoors events, accessible matting for muddy and slippery surfaces will be in place.
- Accessible parking locations and where not possible, provision of drop-off zones.





Limited access and viewing is available on the Shipwreck Trail walking path, maintained by the Great Ocean Road Authority (GORA). This path is maintained to accessibility standards. The Sculpture Trail via the Shipwreck Trail is approximately 2.3km long.


Standard manual wheelchairs are available to hire free of charge and can be collected for for short period use (i.e. less than 2 hours) from our central Information Hub on the Flat or from the Biennale Hub at the Community Connect Building in Otway Street (Small Sculpture exhibition).

Contact manager@lornesculpture at least 24 hours in advance to make a booking for longer periods of use (i.e. in excess of 2 hours).

The Great Ocean Road Authority has 1 x free beach wheelchair (for sand traverse) and hoist available for hire in Lorne. The Lorne main beach has beach access matting from January – April.


Bookings for the beach wheelchair and hoist must be made at least 2 days in advance to ensure availability.

Venue Accessibility

Please see below for information regarding each indoor venue:

Uniting Church Hall

The Uniting Church Hall is best accessed via Smith Street with parking available. Ramp wheelchair access is available. There are no accessible toilets available on site, however the toilets at the CFA will be made available upon booking. Please ensure this is included as part of your booking at least 5 days in advance.

Lorne Bowls Club

The Lorne Bowls Club is an accessible building with wheelchair access and accessible toilets.

• Lorne Community Connect

Lorne Community Connect has wheelchair access and accessible toilets.

Qdos


Indoor events running at Qdos will have wheelchair access and accessible toilets available. For outdoors workshops run on the grounds of Qdos, please indicate any requirements upon booking to ensure access needs will be met in advance.

SculptureSCAPE

SculptureSCAPE will feature temporary or ephemeral artwork by 8 artists over two weekends (19-20 March and 26-27 March).

The artworks will be displayed around the Erskine Rivermouth on the foreshore area and along the banks of the Erskine River.

Access to these sites is not possible without the use of a beach wheelchair. Surfaces are sandy.


Staff and Volunteers
